Dear All Saints Academy Community,





In November of 2021, our community raised \$33,448 at Eaglefest to make upgrades to our Upper Campus ball field and play area. Our first phase was focused on the ball field itself.

At Eaglefest 2022, the All Saints Academy community again came together to raise funds to complete the Upper Campus playground project. Another **\$29,525** was raised during the fund-a-need portion of the auction. A new playground was installed which makes the area an inviting area for families of all ages. Overall, Eaglefest raised over \$121,000...setting a new record in 2022!






